Arrowhead Transit (AEOA) hereby gives public notice of its policy to uphold and assure full compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Civil Right Restoration Act of 1987 and all related statues. Title VI and related statutes prohibiting discrimination in federally assisted programs require that no person in the United States of America shall, on the grounds of race, color, creed, religion, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, marital status, status with regard to public assistance, membership or activity in a local human rights commission, disability, age or other legally protected characteristics, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving federal assistance.
